

Grandma's Glasses Finger Play

Learning Value:

This activity promotes development and learning by encouraging children to demonstrate persistence in actions and behaviors.

Materials Needed:

Participants:

This activity is intended for adult/child interaction.

Directions:

Step 1: Read through the finger play and learn the hand motions. The words are read, it doesn't go to a song or melody.

Step 2: Say the words and do the hand motions for your child. You can do this before story time, at bath time, whenever you have your child's attention. Lead the finger play throughout the week to allow your child enough opportunities to learn it, and ask for it.

These are Grandma's glasses.
(Make glasses over eyes with fingers.)

This is Grandma's hat. (Place hands on top of head.)

And this is the way she folds her hands. (Clasp hands together.)

And lays them in her lap. (Place hands in lap.)

Recite second verse in a deep voice:

These are Grandpa's glasses.
(Make bigger glasses over eyes with fingers.)

This is Grandpa's hat. (Place hands over head to form a large hat.)

And this is the way he folds his arms. (Cross arms.)

And takes a little nap. (Place head on arms as if sleeping.)
